Citizen of the Year

Colin Weir - Alberta Birds of Prey Foundation

In March 1982, Colin Weir joined Coaldale Insurance, aspiring to establish a bird of prey rescue facility. By 1984, with MLA Bob Bogle's support, he obtained permission to care for birds in his Coaldale backyard.

In 1988, Weir proposed transforming a flood-prone field into a wetland and stormwater retention pond for the Alberta Birds of Prey Centre. Collaborating with MLA Bob Bogle, the Town secured funding from Alberta Environment for the storm ponds' design and construction. Today, this once flood-prone field stands as a testament to 35 years of remarkable achievements in a small Alberta town.

Supported by the Town, Province, and Federal Government, ordinary individuals created the extraordinary Alberta Birds of Prey Centre. In addition to providing flood relief, the center releases thousands of birds, reclaims urban wetlands, and draws tourists. Coaldale's support makes it an inspiring model for communities across Alberta and Canada, showcasing the impact of grassroots initiatives on a global scale.



Group Citizens of the Year

Coaldale United Church Thrift Shop

The Coaldale United Church Thrift Shop began 25 years ago as a modest space and has grown into a multi-room enterprise within the church hall, fostering community connections alongside offering affordable goods. With a commitment to "Reduce; Reuse; Recycle," the shop donated \$24,000 since 2019 to various Coaldale organizations, actively supporting local initiatives.

Fueled by the dedication of around 12 volunteers contributing over 90 hours weekly, the thrift store consistently earns acclaim for its cleanliness, organization, and reasonable prices. Prompted by community support, the store participated in the 2023 Town of Coaldale's Winter Walk in the Park, publicly expressing gratitude for their generosity.

Being recognized as the Group Citizens of the Year-2023 by the Coaldale Chamber of Commerce is a significant honor, acknowledging the collective efforts and positive impact of the thriving thrift community.

Myrna Moulton

Male Athlete of the Year

Brad Erdos

Brad Erdos, born on April 26, 1990, embarked on his football journey at Catholic Central High School after attending St. Joseph's School. Transitioning to Simon Fraser University (SFU) in 2008, he played offensive line for the SFU Clan, competing in both CIS and NCAA. Drafted 27th overall by the Calgary Stampeders in 2012, he joined the team in 2014 after overcoming an injury and completing his degree in criminology with a minor in Kinesiology.

Erdos became a key figure on the Stampeders' offensive line, notably at right guard, and winning two Grey Cup victories in 2014 and 2018. However, a patella tendon injury in 2019 led to a season-ending setback. After the cancellation of the 2020 season, Erdos retired from the CFL in February 2021, choosing to pursue a career in law enforcement in Calgary.

Grateful for his football journey, Erdos acknowledges the unwavering support of his wife Amanda, devoted parents Brian and Debbie, and expresses gratitude to the Town of Coaldale for their recognition.


