ESTATE DONATIONS POLICY

All designated (restricted) donated funds will be used for the sole purpose for which it was earmarked for by the donating family as soon as appropriately feasible, unless otherwise stipulated within the will of the deceased and/or original terms of the donation.

All undesignated estate funds are to be placed in an internally restricted reserve for the purpose of funding significant capital projects. In order for funds to be withdrawn, the executive director will create a proposal and relevant business case to be presented to the board. Pending board approval, the funds will be released for the design, necessary permitting, and construction of the project. Under no circumstances are the internally restricted estate donations to be used for general operating costs.

Until such a time that the internally restricted estate funds are used they are to held in a separate interest yielding bond account of limited risk exposure. Under no conditions are funds to be used to invest in stocks, shares, ETFs, or any other financial investment that contains inherent financial risk. All interest accrued will remain within the internally restricted estate fund.





He is well aware of his route and what is required of him for each delivery. People in the community are getting to know Chris as they see him doing his work weekly.

When consistent supports can understand the individual needs of a person, as well as encourage them to

achieve their potential, everybody wins. Chris is flourishing as an active member of his community and building strong, long lasting relationships.









A couple of years ago Jane* experienced consecutive falls that resulted in broken bones and severely restricted mobility. She spent months in hospital recuperating from multiple surgeries; it was debatable whether she would be able to return to her home.

With the support and advocacy of her Rehoboth staff, the local Occupational Therapist and guardian, she has made a slow and steady recovery. Additional assistive technologies were implemented in her home to meet her mobility and safety needs. As a result, she has been able to stay in her current home supported by her dedicated staff.

A year ago, Jane was unable to walk at all but was working towards standing transfers from her bed or recliner chair to her wheelchair. It was clear that she wanted more as she began trying to get out of her chair unassisted.

Although this resulted in a couple of additional falls, she was blessed with no further injuries. Jane made it clear that she wanted more independence and continued to fight for it. With the support of her residential staff, she has continued building up her strength to where she can walk short distances in her home using her walker.

Jane has shown a depth of perseverance that surpasses many. She shows us that when life knocks you down (literally), hard work, determination and a strong spirit will get you back up again!



CELEBRATING 40 YEARS WITH REHOBOTH

What do 667 children in the Edmonton region have in common? They were all part of the Joyful Noise Choir through the past 40 years. As Rehoboth's ambassadors, they made a significant contribution to the development of Camp Rehoboth and the building relationships with Rehoboth's communities.

In November, 2018, present and past members of the choir had an opportunity to sing together in a concert and service with the theme, "Harvest of Praise". Fifty-seven alumni joined the 53- member Joyful Noise in presenting worship music from past and present. Included in the alumni choir were parents of current members of Joyful Noise allowing the two

generations to bring praise together. The celebration also brought together alumni from the 2008 choir. At the 30th anniversary, choir members wrote letters reflecting on their experiences in choir and gathered mementos that were placed in a sealed time capsule to be opened the evening of the 40th anniversary concert. There was lots of laughter as the children, now adults, read their letters from 10 years earlier.

The celebration was also an opportunity to encourage support for Camp Rehoboth. Along with donations received from supporters at a concert in Grande Prairie and a worship service in LaGlace during choir tour, the children were able to raise sufficient funds for installation of an Audio-visual

system in the new Mess Hall. The Joyful Noise received also support in early 2018 to create a documentary film on the history of the choir and the relationship that developed with Rehoboth. As part of the project, both the concert and service were recorded and filmed and the package will be released in 2019 as a double set (DVD and CD).
