ESTATE DONATIONS POLICY

All designated (restricted) donated funds will be used for the sole purpose for which it was earmarked for by the donating family as soon as appropriately feasible, unless otherwise stipulated within the will of the deceased and/or original terms of the donation.

All undesignated estate funds are to be placed in an internally restricted reserve for the purpose of funding significant capital projects. In order for funds to be withdrawn, the executive director will create a proposal and relevant business case to be presented to the board. Pending board approval, the funds will be released for the design, necessary permitting, and construction of the project. Under no circumstances are the internally restricted estate donations to be used for general operating costs.

Until such a time that the internally restricted estate funds are used they are to held in a separate interest yielding bond account of limited risk exposure. Under no conditions are funds to be used to invest in stocks, shares, EFT's, or any other financial investment that contains inherent financial risk. All interest accrued will remain within the internally restricted estate fund.

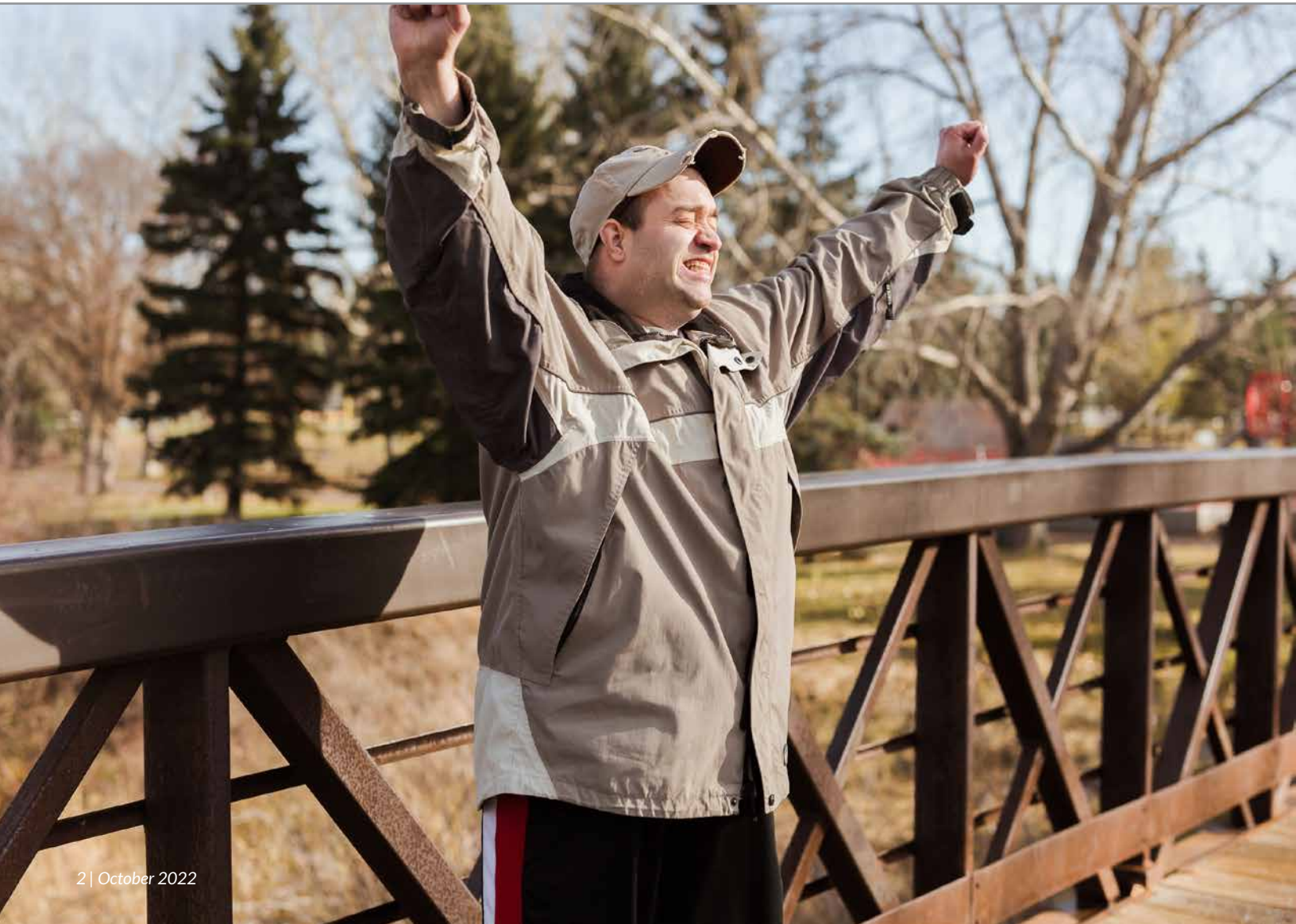

We are also calling on you and all members of our community to advocate for RCM and increased government funding for the Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PDD) program. This program has not received an increase in funding for eight years. With inflation and worker shortages you can imagine the stress that the whole organization is under trying to attract and properly compensate such essential and dedicated staff. You will find helpful supports for doing your part for advocacy at rcmflourish.ca/voice-matters. Thanks to all of you in advance. Thank you for renewing your membership every year. Thank you especially for your prayers and volunteerism.

ADD YOUR VOICE

According to the Bank of Canada's Inflation Calculator, a "basket" of goods and services that cost \$100 in 2014 will now cost you \$121.45. That's a 21.45 percent decrease in the value of your buying power in just eight years.

Now imagine if you did not receive a pay increase over those eight years.

That's the plight of Rehoboth employees and the employees of every agency supporting adults with developmental disabilities. There has been no increase in wage funding from the Alberta government since 2014. For employees embraced as essential during the pandemic, we don't think that's right.

Job Description

We are currently hiring for full time/ part time Client Service Worker and Practitioner positions across all hours (days/ evenings/ weekends) in ALL REGIONS. We offer competitive wages ranging from \$15.85 - \$22.32.

Description:

The Client Services Worker/Practitioner reports to the Client Service Lead. The CSW/P is responsible for the supervision, work and home life skill development, and social skill development of the client. This person works primarily within a team setting, however, may also work independently within a program or through community access. This is front line position that has responsibility to support and facilitate the development of skills and competencies that will assist clients to pursue and fulfill their goals, objectives and aspirations. The CSW/P monitors the efficiency, safety and comfort of services, provides direction for employees, clients and families; ensures that client needs are identified and addressed in keeping with the organizations philosophies, policies and procedures.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Equivalent of High School education from a recognized institution (or currently enrolled in High School)
- Proficient command/comprehension of the English language
- Police Information Check that does not disqualify you from employment
- Computer literacy and proficiency in the use of basic office applications

Working with their support staff, individuals are figuring out new ways to make friends and nurture existing relationships through:

- Staying in touch with people (co-workers, family, natural supports)
- Church, community classes/activities, go bowling
- Reconnecting with old friends
- Attending social gatherings
- Getting to know the neighbors

Developing and maintaining good friendships takes effort. The enjoyment and comfort friendship can provide, however, makes the investment worthwhile.

In 1986, a young boy named Christopher was entrusted to the care and support of Rehoboth Christian Ministries, a new agency whose mission was to enable people with disabilities to enjoy lives of fullness and dignity.

When Christopher and Rehoboth began their journey together, it was clear God's providence shone a light on their path. His watchful eye and deliberate blessings enabled this fledgling agency to enrich lives – of Christopher, David, and Sean, and others to come – by making room for them and helping them to live full lives. The LORD's wisdom and love allowed for Christopher to become the very first child in southern Alberta to receive government funding.

Christopher's journey on the shoulders of Rehoboth staff would often be challenging. Along with the glorious peaks of joy, there would be valleys in the shadow of discouragement.

A BARRIER FREE HOME FROM DREAM TO REALITY

Individuals, staff and the community were blessed by the opening on Christopher Place in December of 2021 and celebrated with friends and family during the Grand Opening in July. This home offers barrier-free living for the individuals in the form of accessible washrooms, kitchen, larger hallways, suites with accessible washrooms, sensory and flex rooms as well as a therapeutic tub with a lift, etc.

Christopher Place truly was a dream turned reality after many years of supporting individuals struggling to age within their homes; more and

more accessible concerns would arise and some individuals even were forced to find alternate services. Not anymore! This home means that individuals within Rehoboth's south region can now age gracefully and with dignity, all while continuing services with Rehoboth.

Individuals live in 11 of the 14 available suites, and work continues to find residents for the three vacant suites. A day program is also offered at Christopher Place – the central location for everyone to meet and share in fellowship before heading out into the community.
